The earliest any of you should be able to see this article would December 28th; the 4th Day of Christmas. And so, we are only still at the beginning of the Christmas season for this year. I'm sure some of you might have already heard someone say; or perhaps you have been thinking yourselves, "I Wish It Could Be Christmas Every Day"



Why would someone have that wish? Well, because for many people (I know, not all), Christmas has a way of bringing out the best in us. We smile a little bit more. We forgive faster. We hold doors open longer and say things like, "Oh no, you go first." Strangers wave and greet each other, "Have a blessed Christmas". Families make a special effort to gather. And even people who never sing, suddenly know all the words to "Joy to the World" or "Away in a Manger."

But if we're honest – part of what makes Christmas so special is that it doesn't last forever. Eventually the tree dries out, the ornaments go back in the box labeled "Fragile," and the world returns to its normal pace. Credit card bills arrive. Diets resume. And the radio stops playing carols every seven minutes. Still, that wish lingers among many: If only we could keep this feeling.

Maybe that's because Christmas isn't really about the decorations or the cookies or even the presents. It's about Emmanuel – God with us. That there is the wonderful truth, even we Christians, can too easily and too quickly forget. Though the baby in the manger did not remain a baby, but grew into a toddler, a young boy and eventually a grown man, He never did stop being Emmanuel. He did not pack up and leave us on December 26th regardless of what happens with the store decorations or even our weary feelings of "good cheer."

The angel didn't say to the shepherds, "Unto you is born this day a Savior... available through Christmas only." No, Jesus came to stay. The peace we feel at Christmas – it's still available in January. The season name simply changes to Epiphany, where – Ah Hah! we see Jesus baptized and turning water into wine, etc. – still the Son of God and Savior for us all.


The generosity we practice in December? Yes, we still need it in the spring when we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost and in the weeks that follow, as He strengthens and nurtures and sustains us in His gift of faith every day.

And the kindness we show to strangers in line at the store? It is just as holy on Ash Wednesday and through the season of Lent and Easter, when we learn again of the Savior's sacrificial kindness and love on the cross and in His resurrection victory for us all.

In fact, as Jesus told His disciples (and us) just before He ascended to prepare our eternal home before the heavenly throne of God, "Surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age" (Mat. 28:20).

You know, when we wish it could be Christmas every day, maybe what we're really wishing for is that we could live every day in the glory and joy and awareness of Jesus' presence; understanding and living in the peace; in the reality that He is watching, guiding, loving, and inviting us to live differently.

And the good news is...we can. Because the same one whose birth we celebrate now in Christmas is the Savior who is with us always and into eternity because He



has wrapped us in His own Christmas gift – the robe of His righteousness in baptism. We are, every day, clothed in His presence as long as we haven't closed the eyes of our faith to it.

So go ahead – sing the carols a little longer. Keep the joy and good will up well into the New Year, and share Christ's grace like every morning is Christmas morning, because, while the season changes, the Savior never does.

And when you find yourself thinking, "I wish it could be Christmas every day", know with all certainty that with Jesus, it already is!

Thoughts from your Elder

Does anybody else have that one person in their life who causes you to stumble in your walk with Christ? And just when you think the

Holy Spirit has made a breakthrough for your path to become smooth, a landslide appears out of nowhere? 
