

Since we were unable to find a guest preacher for our Consecration Sunday this year, I thought you still might enjoy "hearing" the stewardship perspective of a different voice besides mine. So, to that end, I am sharing below (with very few adaptations) an excellent article, written by The Rev. Dr. Nathan Meador, who is the LCMS South Wisconsin District president and former stewardship specialist for LCMS Stewardship Ministry (who also happens to be my friend and seminary classmate). His article is titled *Stewardship Essentials: Discipline*.

What is the difference between an athlete and a champion? What is the distinction between one who competes in business or academics and the one who achieves at the highest levels? Certainly, no athlete becomes a champion or the greatest of all time (GOAT) without talent. No student or business leader achieves their loftiest goals without opportunity. There is a line of demarcation between the elite and those who simply compete. It is discipline.

It is discipline that leads the champion golfer to pound thousands of range balls a month. It is discipline that led the hall of fame hitters to take swing after swing in the batting cage. It is discipline that leads the virtuoso to practice his/her instrument hours on end. Discipline is the necessary effort that makes excellence possible.

But, for most people, discipline is not any fun. It is tedious. It is boring. It requires a repeated effort, which is the cause of sweat, aches and sometimes even tears. Discipline is not pleasant. But it is necessary to move beyond average into the territory of extraordinary.

Those with a history in team sports know that coaches need to set the culture of discipline. When the team is not coached in the disciplines of detail and effort, the team's performance will suffer. The blessings of talent may go a long way, but there will always come a point where discipline and lack of diligence will lead to errors,

breakdowns and defeat.

But the coach can only do so much. In individual sports, the athlete must provide a drive for discipline. Teams can only rise as far as the culture of discipline that the players are willing to participate in. No amount of coaching can overcome a lack of discipline.

The discipline of stewardship - Faithful teaching and practice of stewardship within the local congregation also requires consistent discipline.



People With A Purpose

Congregations that wish to cultivate faithful stewardship need to commit to the regular discipline of teaching and preaching stewardship. This preaching and teaching of stewardship needs to be more than a three-week sermon series that is the forerunner of the first draft of the budget.

Stewardship discipline means that stewardship of all of life and life's resources is regularly taught when the assigned Scripture Readings call for it. There needs to be regular, year-round opportunities for the individual stewards to be encouraged to put in the arduous work of serving, caring, studying and giving of themselves for

the glory of God and for the benefit of their neighbor.

Stewardship discipline should include an annual, intentional commitment process. These commitments are faithfully made when properly framed. Commitments respond to the two main stewardship questions for each believer:

1. How has God blessed me?
2. How is He calling me to respond?

This discipline of the individual for the sake of the whole is essential. Both individual and congregational stewardship is ultimately stewardship of the Gospel!

The fruits of discipline: repentance and faithfulness - Discipline is required because faithful stewardship goes against our sinful human nature. Human beings are not content to be managed by anyone, including God. We

have the desire to own, possess and control.

But at its root, this is idolatry. Idolatry is a sin which challenges us all. We think that our money is ours. We think that our skills are ours. We think that our time is ours. But none of that is true. It all belongs to the Lord.

The discipline of God's Law calls us to repentance and leads us back to being stewards, rather than owners. While not pleasant, it is essential if we are to be the stewards that the Lord has created and redeemed us to be. The repetitive, consistent call to repentance and new life can be tedious and painful. But it is what makes us stewards!

In fact, it is through this strengthening discipline that God lovingly calls us away from ourselves and back into His loving embrace so that we can most fully, effectively and joyfully serve Him and others

according to the Mission He has given us here at Mt. Calvary as His *People With A Purpose*.

Thank you all so much for plugging into our *People With A Purpose* journey this year. If you have not yet been able to fill out a pledge card, prayerfully consider doing so to support us all in *Sharing God's Word and Serving All*.

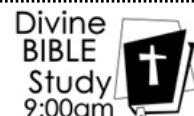

3. Prayers on Friday must be sent before noon so they will make printing in the bulletin. After noon a message will need to be left on the church voicemail before 8 AM on Sunday if you wish for Pastor to announce it in church. Prayer requests to Jan can be made at any time.

The prayer team is here to help you with your prayers please feel free to contact us at any time. Jan Hagen

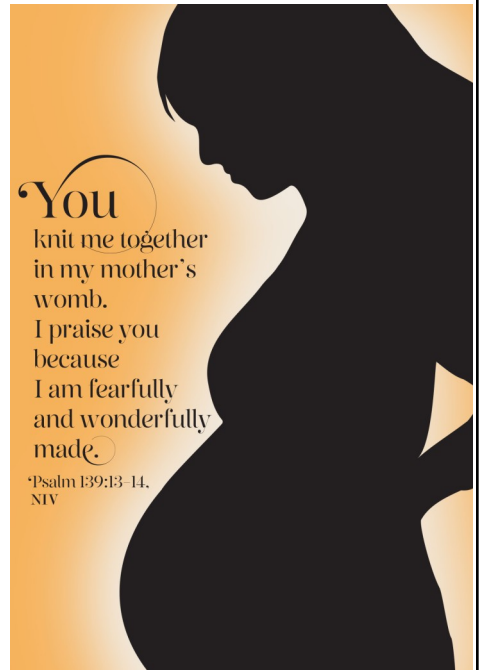




Greetings people loved by God!

For Advent, Pastor used a sermon

series he called "The Lord Opens Wombs". Listening to his sermons brought back memories of me and DeDe's struggles early in our marriage. Many of our friends were having children and we wanted children also, but were not able to at the time. We both went to doctors and were told DeDe would have to take some medicine that could help. It didn't. So, the next step was In vitro fertilization (IVF) which could/would implant multiple fertilized eggs. This can be dangerous to the mother if too many begin to grow, so then they have a process that is called "selective reduction". We called it abortion and murder. So, as bad as we wanted children, we were not willing to do that. As many of you know, we adopted our oldest son Dalton.



During Advent I also saw a short video with Seth Gruber, who is a leading voice in the Pro Life movement, and he said "Abortion is the sacrament of Satan. It says you must die so I can live, but Christ said I must die so you can live. This is why abortion advocates speak the blasphemous words, "My body my choice." They misapply the words of our Savior at the Last Supper, "This is My body given for you."

I was told many years ago that when the sperm enters the egg, a unique DNA is formed. This tells me that life begins at conception. Then this last Sunday Pastor quoted from Psalm 139:13 "For you formed my inward parts; you knitted me together in my mother's womb".

We humans do many foolish things; some have abortions, and all have sinned, but we are forgiven and washed clean by the blood of the Lamb. Let us fight for the unborn men and women alike. And let us pray for and support our sisters in Christ who are unsure or may have had an abortion.

The Epistle for Christmas Eve was taken from Titus 3:4-7 and I think it's a good way to close. "But when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, He saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to His own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, whom He poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that being justified by His grace we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life."
