


News From The Mount

May 2024

he month of May for many of us is a very busy month. Here in Colorado it's viewed as the first real month of spring – preparing and planting gardens, cleaning things up both inside and outside of the house, planning and implementing projects that have been on hold for the winter, not to mention the opportunity to more confidently engage in all manner of outdoor recreational activities (hikes, picnics, trips to the mountains, softball and little league sign-ups and practices, etc.). But that's only the tip of the iceberg for all of the May "busyness" opportunities and commitments. May is also the month for College and High School graduations, and one of the most common months for weddings – and of course, we must make our plans early for Mother's Day.



With all of these things grabbing for our attention in the month of May,

though, something has to give, right? There's only so much energy; so much time in a day. So, sadly the month of May each year is also the beginning of the annual "spring and summer exodus" from the Church. Now, before the devil gets ahold of your mind and tempts you to think something like, "See, all Pastor is worried about is the attendance and/or offering numbers", let me assure you that those things – as important as they actually are to Christ more than they are to me, those are <u>not</u> my biggest concern. My reason for bringing this up is because the "May exodus" is only a symptom of a far greater concern that is steadily tightening its grip upon us Christians as a whole.

We, in our current time and culture, are falling more and more under the demonic spell of what has been more formally labeled as *Moral Nihilism*. I know that's not a term that the average person in America walks around using at the store or at work or with your family and friends. But let me assure you, whether you use the term or not, the concern is very real because it is dragging our country, our families and our very souls farther and farther away from that which God and His Word in Scripture says we all <u>must be about</u> in this life.

So, what is *Moral Nihilism*? First of all, though our current culture is ripe for this false way of thinking, it is as old as the human race. Ecclesiastes 1:9 says, "What has been is what will be, and what has been done is what will be done, and <u>there is nothing new under the sun</u>." When the devil tempted Eve in the Garden of Eden he tempted her to reconsider what God gave to mankind as His perfect guidelines for life. That is that God, as the Creator, is the One who sets the rules; who defines what is right and what is wrong. That's what the word "moral" means: "the principals of right and wrong behavior". But the devil challenged Eve to question God's authority and His rules saying, "Did God actually say, 'You shall not eat of any tree in the garden'?" And then he lied to her, telling her that "when you eat of [the fruit] you will be like God" (Gen. 3:1, 5). That leads to the word "Nihilism", which comes from the Latin word "nihil" that means "nothing". *Nihilism* is the philosophy or thinking that there is no truth; that everything is useless, so there are no reasons to be concerned about moral principles (right or wrong) for yourself or anyone else. Everything is meaningless.

This way of thinking is what Hitler and the Nazis promoted among the German Christians in the 1940s to lull them into a state of spiritual laziness and thereby get the church and its leaders to "fall in line" with the Nazi agenda.

No, I'm not equating the people who are part of the "May exodus" from the Church today with Nazis. I'm merely calling all of us to open our eyes to the seriousness of where things can lead when we allow the temptations of this world's "busyness" to tear away and degrade God's established place of importance in our lives and in His Creation. I've heard more than once from Christians that we shouldn't "make such a big deal" about those issues or agendas or mindsets in the world that differ from God's Word; that we shouldn't be so concerned about what is "right" and what is "wrong"; that "God doesn't care if I'm in worship on Sunday or if I'm involved in His Church". That's *Moral Nihilism* and it is just blatantly false according to God.

The reason God gave us His Word is because of His extreme love for us. The reason He established His Church is because He wants to protect us from the sneaky schemes of the devil; because He wants us to be blessed instead by His truth and stay connected to Him into eternity. So He gave us His moral law (The Ten Commandments) which very clearly say, "You shall have no other gods before Me" (including any and all of the temptations I mentioned at the beginning that pull us away into setting up our own rights and wrongs). The Third Commandment also says, "Remember the Sabbath Day by keeping it holy". And Hebrews 10:24-25 agrees saying, "...let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near." These are not God's "suggestions" but commands; given to us as His gifts so that we will not fall under Satan's control.

So, it does matter greatly what we believe <u>and</u> how we live as God's people every day. It matters that Jesus is "the way, and the truth, and the life." And that "No one comes to the Father except through [Him]" (Jn. 14:6). It does matter that we believe Jesus died in our place – to pay for our sin on the cross <u>and</u> that Jesus rose from the dead in victory over sin and Satan. It matters that we know these to be <u>right</u> and true, and conversely that anything against God's Word is <u>wrong</u> and harmful. These things are not "nothing" (nihil). They are absolutely crucial for us to learn about, to encourage each other in and to gather together in Worship weekly (at least) and to study God's truths together so that we can stay protected from going down the same path that others have gone before us who have fallen out of salvation.


So, enjoy God's wonderful blessing of the season of spring. See how it points us to the new and resurrected life that Jesus gives to us in His saving work. Go out and embrace God's gifts in this world that He created for us. But do so, always keeping Him and His life for us as His people as your first priority; as the one non-negotiable when you are planning your schedules, setting your budgets and using your talents and the gifts He has given to you; all the while celebrating that *Christ is risen. He is risen indeed. Alleluia!*



My personal favorite passage of Scripture is Proverbs 1:7, "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and discipline."

Much of my resources come from a book found within our church library on the bookshelves near the restrooms titled: *What Luther Says*. My selections are currently from the discussions of Truth. (The number is the exact reference point in the book.)

4501 Personal Certainty at Death Indispensable

Luther says, "See to it that you are well armed and fortified so that you are able to stand before God and the world when you are assailed, and especially when the devil attacks

you at the hour of death... Everyone must stand on his own feet and be prepared to give battle to the devil. You must ground yourself on a strong and clear passage of Scripture with which you may stand the test. If you do not possess it, you cannot pass the trial. Then the devil will pluck you like a withered leaf."

4508 Man Does Not Love the Truth

"Truth is the most intolerable thing on earth."

4511 The World Hates the Saving Truth

"Our sin [in the world's eyes] is that we tell people the truth: that they are to rely on nothing either in heaven or on earth except the merit and death of our Lord Jesus Christ. This teaching is our sin" (according to the world).






We sent out Easter Greeting cards to various members of the congregation and they were well received.

3rd month/7-8 weeks of Jesus' earthly existence

May 15 – Now in His seventh week – when most mothers are first becoming certain of being with child – Jesus exhibits a complete skeleton (we can count all ten fingers and toes),

electrical brain wave patterns, pain and pressure receptors, and muscle reflexes.

Baby at 8 Weeks

- + All major organs and external body structures have begun to form.
- + Baby's heart beats with a regular rhythm.
- + The arms and legs grow longer, and fingers and toes have begun to form.

- + The eyes have moved forward on the face and eyelids have formed.
- + The umbilical cord is clearly visible.
- At the end of 8 weeks, baby is a fetus and looks more like a human. Baby is nearly 1 inch long and weighs less than 1/8 of an ounce.

On April 12, Kent, Elizabeth, and Mary Ann attended the March for Life at the Colorado State Capitol. The LCMS Rocky Mountain district provided a tour bus to the site.

We listened to interesting speakers. One stated that there is current legislation trying to pass a law that would make the <u>reversal pill</u> for chemical abortion <u>illegal</u> in <u>Colorado</u>.

They also stated that there is a petition (that has enough signatures to get on the ballot) to enshrine the <u>right to abortion</u> into the <u>Colorado constitution</u>. Colorado is one of seven most permissive states on abortion.
